

- > Distribution was made in person, restaurant to restaurant.



What

Ranked-choice voting is an electoral system that allows people to vote for multiple candidates in order of preference

NYC will use Ranked-Choice Voting (RCV) in primary and special elections for local offices, including: Mayor, Public Advocate, Comptroller, Borough President, and City Council.

Ranked-choice voting will be used in all special elections taking place after January 1, 2021. The first citywide election with Ranked-choice voting will be the Primary Election on lune 22, 2021.

Why

Ranked-choice voting gives voters more agency in deciding who gets elected. Cities that use RCV have also promoted greater diversity in candidate election.

New York elections passed RCV in a 2019 ballot measure with overwhelming support!

How

Rank up to five candidates in order of preference.

If a candidate receives more than 50% of first-choice votes, the candidate is declared the winner.

If no candidate obtains a 50% majority, counting continues in rounds, and candidates with the fewest votes are eliminated.

Those who had ranked eliminated candidates as their first choice will have their votes automatically recast for their secondchoice candidate.


